Congratulations to everyone involved in the provincial Conservative Kidney Management (CKM) project which was recently announced as one of four winners of the 2018 Patient Experience Awards by the Health Quality Council of Alberta (HQCA). The award is to recognize and celebrate initiatives that improve the patient experience in accessing and receiving healthcare services.

Applications spanned all corners of the province and came from a wide variety of care settings. They reflected the diverse healthcare needs of Albertans, and many initiatives specifically considered how to improve the patient, resident, client and family experience for vulnerable populations.

Time to Celebrate!

So much has been achieved since the Conservative Kidney Management project began three years ago in April 2015. The project was established to develop, implement and evaluate a clinical pathway in Northern and Central Alberta nephrology clinics, in collaboration with stakeholders throughout the province including healthcare practitioners across the continuum of care, patients, and families.

Many significant milestones have been achieved and we want to celebrate and thank every person who has helped to make this initiative so successful! In 3 years, together we have:

- ✓ Hosted 2 Provincial World Cafés to gather stakeholder input that informed the clinical pathway
- ✓ Developed and implemented an online, interactive clinical pathway for patients and healthcare practitioners.
- ✓ Hosted multiple education workshops and 3 Innovation Collaborative workshops to implement and measure improvements in the 4 northern Alberta Renal Clinics
- ✓ Developed and implemented an **online** Patient Decision
 Aid tool
- ✓ Made significant clinical and process improvements across every dimension of quality
- ✓ Received the 2017 Great Teams, Great Care Award
- ✓ Received the 2018 HQCA Patient Experience Award

Phase II: Primary Care

We are very excited to announce the expansion of the pathway into primary care. Recently, Dr. Sara Davison, her Research Team, and collaborators from Primary Care were awarded a 3 ½ year CIHR grant to implement the CKM pathway to other parts of the province in primary care. This grant also includes funding to enhance the pathway, and lead the development of a national CKM toolkit in collaboration with other provinces.

Phase III: Chronic Diseases

In addition to expanding the CKM pathway to primary care, we placed first in a <u>national research competition</u> to develop a business proposal that could expand the CKM pathway to other chronic diseases. The team is working closely with multiple Strategic Clinical Networks and the Primary Care Integration Network. If successful, up to \$4.8M in funding will be granted to expand the clinical pathway beyond conservative kidney management.





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
Portraits of Kidney Disease
